



### **Action Plan**

FY18 USDA Farm to School Planning Grant

#### **Background**

As a recipient of a 2018 USDA Farm to School Planning Grant, the Waukee Community School District (WCSD) has developed infrastructure to support farm to school including:

- Establishing a farm to school committee comprised of school and community stakeholders.
- Developing a farm to school vision, logo, and marketing materials.
- Creating a school garden checklist; garden food safety procedure; and revising the district's wellness policy to include support for farm to school activities.
- Adding 5 new edible gardens
- Providing nutrition education, in addition to locally sourced food for taste testing and special events in the lunch room, at summer feeding sites, and in preK-12 classrooms.
- Developing an action plan for farm to school implementation.

#### **Vision**

The vision for WCSD's farm to school program is to 'cultivate opportunities for students and the community to interact with the local food system' through education, hands-on agricultural experiences, and local food procurement strategies.

#### Goal

The overall goal of WCSD's Farm to School Program is to improve access to local foods in eligible schools through comprehensive farm to school programming that includes education, hands-on agricultural experiences, and local food procurement.
