	 Preferences include: Strong values of representation, diversity, and inclusion in texts, stories, and authors A minimum of 7,500 books, with 2+ copies of the most popular titles

reading and interest levels

Preferred balance of approximately 70% fiction / 30% nonfiction appropriate for 9th grade

- Current 9th grade circulation data suggests that the most requested titles fall in the genres of mystery, romance, sports, graphic novels, and historical fiction
- Books written in other languages (fiction and nonfiction) for our speakers of multiple languages and their families
 - Primary needs are for Spanish and Arabic texts for native readers
 - Additional languages to consider are German, Portuguese, Vietnamese, Chinese, Japanese, Turkish, French, and/or Indonesian
- Fiction and nonfiction texts focused on aspects of social-emotional learning
- Nonfiction texts that supplement 9th grade curriculum; a list of topics has been provided below
- Iowa Teen Award winning texts
- Vendor will provide unboxing, shelving, and removal of debris

Following acceptance of a bid, vendors will work in collaboration with Waukee Community School District staff to confirm a final book list as well as binding and processing options.
