TAYLOR SWIFT ERAS TOUR CANCELED?!

On Wednesday, March 22nd, 2023, Taylor Swift announced the cancellation of The Eras Tour due to her recent realization that she is the best artist of all time, and is going to transition into retirement. 

Part of the attraction of the sport is how it is accessible to anyone who wants to participate, no skill levels required. Vollmecke said, "Of course, I can do a cartwheel! I'm an athlete!" Despite this, the club had a surplus of talent, and many athletes went on to have varying levels of success in the sport. The sport has three main events, a 100-meter cartwheel dash, the three-wheel, a race to see who can complete three consecutive cartwheels the fastest and the one-wheel, where the winner is determined by judges on who has the best technique. Cassie Howard, Northwest's star cart wheeler, finished in first place for all three events at the state tournament, ending her senior season undefeated. Howard stated, "I was really glad that Northwest decided to get their own cartwheeling team. It's such an amazing sport, and I think it deserves more recognition."

In late February, Northwest's Cartwheeling Club was invited to Cincinnati, Ohio, for the National High School Cartwheel competition. Prior to this event, the largest cartwheeling contest the CWC had attended was the high school state tournament. However, the competition was thin, and Northwest would sweep all three events. In Ohio, however, the Cartwheel Club faced some high-level competition. One hundred teams from around the country attended the tournament to compete for the title of Top Cart Wheeler. The Northwest Cartwheel Club finished 3rd overall in the nation, an outstanding feat for such a young team. Howard won gold in the three-wheel, her specialty event, and silver in the 100-meter cartwheel dash. Maddie Perez, a sophomore athlete, stated, "Going to the national competition was an amazing experience. It helped the whole team learn more about the sport, and we were able to face some really amazing competition."

Going into next year's season, the team aspires to bring more awareness to the sport and recruit more athletes. Completing their first-ever year in tremendous success, the Cartwheel Club set the foundation for many more successful teams in years to come.

COVID-2.0 is on a marise and everyone should stay home and properly social distance until advised differently by the government.



while loan forgiveness has seen heavy debate within the government, both sides of the debate finally agreed upon a new system: FAFSA, the Fighting Application for Federal Student Aid. This system awards students money not based on academics, but rather physical merit.

This would see potential students fight in arenas across the nation for their scholarships. These fights would be in a tournament setup, granting increased sums of money as students win more and more fights. While this system has received controversy, many argue it is a perfect medium for financial aid. Congresswoman Kay Oss stated, "We initially debated continuing a system of financial aid based on academic merit, but this made so much more sense. If you are smart enough to pick up a pencil and write Pythagorean theorem, you are smart enough to pick up a battleaxe and fight." Many colleges have begun to implement their own fighting tournaments. Large colleges across lowa, such as lowa State and the University of lowa, will reportedly implement scholarships for pistol duels, boxing, and many more forms of fighting.

This system has received its fair share of debate over the ethics of having students compete in fight pits. Supporters argue that this new system is far more ethical than requiring students to complete the brutal process of submitting federal aid applications. Many other students argue that the skills rewarded by the new FAFSA are much more important. FAFSA winner and student Maximus Meridius stated, "I mean yeah, you could just complete an ACT and an application, but is that really the best way to judge someone's abilities? This appears to be a popular sentiment, as 100 percent of the winners interviewed agreed that the new FAFSA was a better system.

While the system is loved, many argue that the new FAFSA needs more regulations. The original bill passed was purposely designed to be vague, allowing for school and state interpretations of competition types and money payouts, but some believe this is a bad idea. Iowan student, Joe King said, "This whole thing is a mess. Last time I checked they don't even have weight classes or rules. With this in mind, many new activists are demanding radical change in this system, including medical staff being present and basic rules to ensure student safety. Though some argue that this is simply not necessary.

For now, FAFSA remains the system of choice for financial aid in America. Despite its controversies, the government has held its ground and made one message clear. Students who want funds will need to fight for them.

RECESS IS A NEW REQUIRED CLASS

Northwest High School is to add a new required class in the fall of 2023: the beloved recess.

After a rise in depression rates from grades 6-12, many states across America began to add the class. However, Waukee is adding a classic American twist. Recess will not act as a free period or lunchtime, but rather as a class. Students will be assessed and graded on how they spend their recess. Waukee Community Schools District board member Ivana Creye adds, "Passing grades will be given to those who take the time to really embrace their inner child and view recess not as a waste of time, but as an opportunity to enjoy one's self." Students who spend their time working on school work will likely fail recess, as that's not why it is becoming a required course for all students.

Of course, there are some who voice concerns about this new school requirement. Some teachers are worried about how recess will affect their lunch periods, and how the school day schedule will be impacted. AP Calculus teacher at Northwest, Torr Churezkids comments, "These students have their whole lives to be sad about things, but what really matters is that the teachers can still have a 30-minute lunch break so we don't have to hear their whining. I understand this is to help with students' mental health, but the teachers still have feelings too."

Between the grades of sixth grade to senior year, depression rates for teenagers rise by 1,703%. Many scientists are baffled by these statistics and are searching for the cause of this crisis. After an intensive research project in Argentina in 2019, child psychologist Elaine Greenfield discovered that a main benefactor in teenage depression is the removal of recess. Greenfield says, "Many children associate recess with periods of their life filled with joy and unawareness. Being able to give them back a piece of that ignorant bliss from their childhood will help many teenagers cope with the stress of impending adulthood."

Since then, many school systems across the world have started to add recess back into their curriculum, and the results have been incredible. A reported 76% decrease in suicidal thoughts or depressive episodes in teenage students after just one school year of recess in high school classes in the United Kingdom. A recent study in 2022 found that nearly all the students who had recess in high school were obtaining better grades, skipping school less, and getting involved in more extracurricular activities.
